#### <u>NEPAL</u>

Nepal boasts eight of the world's tallest mountains and the world's oldest Hindu and Buddhist sites. While Kathmandu Valley is made of three ancient cities filled with enchanting medieval palaces, pagodas, temples, statues and stupas, the rest of the kingdom offers unparalleled adventure options with abundance in flora and fauna. As for its people - From the Tharus that share their land with the splendid Asian tuskers in the plains to the brave Yak herders of Dolpo, they are as amazing as the land itself. Here in its tropical jungles the Royal Bengal Tiger prowls, higher up the legend of the Yeti lives on. Although modernization has set in, the quintessence of ancient Nepal remains amongst its people.

### **DETAIL ITINERAY**

#### Day 01: Arrival at Kathmandu

Arrival at Kathmandu International airport. Meet & welcome by our representative & transfer to hotel. Welcome drink followed by tour briefing. Rest of the day is free for personal activities. Overnight in Kathmandu.

#### Day 02: Kathmandu Sightseen

Wake up early in the Morning, have a breakfast by enjoying beautiful mountain views. After breakfast, our representative will drive you to Kathmandu and after arriving, checking in the hotel and have lunch at hotel. After lunch, Visit **Pashupatinath Temple**, **Boudhanath Stupa**, **Swayambhunath Stupa and Patan Durbar Square**.

**The Pashupatinath Temple** is a Hindu Temple dedicated to Pashupati, a form of Shiva. It is located in Kathmandu, Nepal near the Bagmati river. The temple was classified as a World Heritage Site in 1979. This "extensive Hindu temple precinct" is a "sprawling collection of temples, ashrams, images and inscriptions raised over the centuries along the banks of the sacred Bagmati river", and is one of seven monument groups in UNESCO's designation of Kathmandu Valley.

**Boudhanath Stupa** is also known as Boudhanath, Khasti Chaitya And khasa is a stupa in Kathmandu, Nepal. Located about 11 km from the Centre and northeastern outskirts of Kathmandu, its massive mandala makes it one of the largest spherical stupas in Nepal and the world. The Stupa is said to entomb the remains of Kassapa Buddha. It is located on the ancient trade route from Tibet route from Tibet which enters the Kathmandu Valley by the village of Sankhu in the Northeast corner and continues to the ancient and smaller stupa of Chabahil named Charumati Stupa.

**Swayambhunath Stupa** is an ancient religious complex atop a hill in the Kathmandu Valley, west of Kathmandu city. The Tibetan name for the site means 'Sublime Trees' (Wylie: Phags.pa Shing.kun), for the many varieties of trees found on the hill. However, Shingun may be of in Nepal Bhasa name for the complex, Swayambhu, meaning 'self-sprung'. For the Buddhist Newars, in whose mythological history and origin myth as well as day-to-day religious practice Swayambhu occupies a central position, it is the most sacred among Buddhist pilgrimage sites. For Tibetans and followers of Tibetan Buddhism, it is second only to Boudha. Swayambhu is the Hindu name.

**PATAN DURBAR SQUARE** is Located 5km southeast of Kathmandu, the Patan city popularly known as 'the city of artisans' accommodates a magnificent square housing the palace buildings of the then royals, artistic courtyards and graceful pagoda

temples – a display of Newari architecture that had reached its pinnacle during the reign of the Malla kings. It is filled with wood and stone carvings, metal statues, and ornate architecture, including dozens of Buddhist and Hindu temples, and over 1200 monuments.

#### Day 03: Drive to Pokhara via Manakamana temple

After sunrise, have a breakfast and you'll be travelling to Pokhara by road. It will take about 6/7 hours journey. In the way, you'll observing the scenic views on the national highway along the Trishuli River. Enroute, **visit Manakamana Temple** by Cable Car (optional). Upon arrival, check into the hotel. Evening walk around lake side and enjoy the view of western Himalayan ranges with Mt. Fishtail. Return back to hotel and stay overnight.

#### Day 04: Pokhara sightseen

Wake up early in the morning and have a breakfast at the hotel. After the breakfast, our representative will drive to the airport for the flight back to Pokhara. It will be about 20 minutes flight from Jomsom to Pokhara. After landing, check-in into the hotel and we will visit **Davi's Fall**, **Gupteshwar Mahadev cave**, **Bindhyabasini Temple & Fewa Lake** with1 hour boat ride on Lake Fewa. **Davi's fall** is a waterfall located at Pokhara in Kaski District, Nepal. The water forms a tunnel after reaching the bottom. This tunnel is approximately 500 feet long and runs 100 feet below ground level. his attraction has become one of the most popular sights in Nepal. Also known as Devi's Falls, David's Falls, Devin Falls and Davis Falls, the name might take on different forms, but the sight remains the same. It is an area that is known for its beauty and tranquility, and the legend of the Devi's Falls adds a touch of mystery and adventure to this sight.

**Gupteshwar Mahadev cave** is a cave located in Pokhara-16, Batulechaur, Kaski district, close to the Kali khola, it is a large limestone cave. It is a rare example of a cave system in Nepal containing stalagmites and stalactites. This show cave attracts thousands of tourists every year. A statue of Hindu lord Shiva can be found inside the cave.

**Bindhyabasini Temple** is the oldest temple in the city of Pokhara, Nepal. It's located in Ward No. 2, Miruwa. It regularly attracts a large number of locals, Nepalese from across the country, and foreigners alike. The main temple is devoted to the goddess Bindhyabasini, a Bhagwati who is the incarnation of Kali.

**Fewa Lake** Phewa Lake, Phewa Tal or Fewa Lake is a freshwater lake in Nepal formerly called Baidam Tal located in the south of the Pokhara Valley that includes Pokhara city and parts of Sarangkot and Kaskikot. There is also a Tal Barahi Temple Hindu temple on the center of the lake. If people want to visit the temple, they must take a boat. Phewa Lake is the second largest lake in the Nepal. It is the only lake in Nepal, that have a Temple in the center of the lake. And that temple is called Barahi Mandir. Its Area is about 4.43km.sq.

**Tal Barahi** Temple is also known as 'Lake Temple' or 'Barahi Temple' is a Hindu temple of the goddess Barahi. It is the most important religious monument in Pokhara, Nepal. This temple is located on a small island in the middle of Phewa Lake. As the temple is situated on a small island, the only way to visit it is by boat. The temple is a symbol of the manifestation of Ajima representing the female force

### Day 05: Pokhara to Chitwan

Drive to Chitwan (about 160 km, 5 hrs. drive). Transfer to Hotel for check –in. Upon arrival, lunch will be served at Hotel restaurant. Evening, sunset and visit local Tharu village to enjoy Tharu Stick (Cultural) Dance. Overnight in Chitwan Hotel.

### Day 06: Chitwan- Jungle Activities and drive back to kathmandu

Wakeup call with tea / coffee followed by Nature walk and Bird watching tour. Breakfast & start jungle safari to see different kinds of deer, rhinoceros, wild boar, leopard, monkeys, birds and many other smaller animals. After jungle safari tour proceed for Dugout Canoe Ride along with Dungre / Rapti River to see 2 type of rare species of crocodile; the marsh mugger and the fish-eating Gharial. Visit elephant breeding farm & drive back to the lodge. Overnight at the jungle resort / lodge. After having Jungle safari, you'll be travelling back to Kathmandu and stay overnight.

### Day 07: Departure from Kathmandu

Check out of the hotel and transfer to the airport for your flight back home
